COTTONTAIL RABBIT

Common Name: cottontail

Other Names:

rabbit, bunny

Scientific Name: Sylvilagus floridanus

Appearance:

length

- about 15 inches

weight

- between 2 and 3 1/2 pounds - buffy gray with white underbelly

other

- rather large ears (to 4 inches) and cotton ball tail

Range:

- statewide

Habitat:

- wooded edges, brushy fields, shrubby yards

Diet:

- young woody stems, many herbaceous plants, many grasses

Reproduction: - 3-4 young per litter

- 4-6 litters per year

ehavior:

- most active after dark

- most common in suburban yards where dense shrubbery or

brushpiles are available

- no social structure in populations

Problems:

- can be very damaging to some woody ornamentals

- damaging in vegetable gardens, especially to legumes (beans, peas)

and cabbage family

- may chew bark of young trees

Solutions:

- fence around beds or plants at least two feet high

- use landscape plants less susceptible to damage

- use of live traps is often ineffective when rabbit populations are high

- use of repellents, scare devices and ultrasonics are generally

ineffective

- lethal control can be effective where legal

Legal Aspects: - may be destroyed when damaging property
