Common Name: Carolina wren

Other Names: mocking wren, great Carolina wren, Louisiana wren

Scientific Name: Thyrothorus Iudovicianus

Appearance:

size

- 5.5 inches long

color

- rusty brown above, buffy white below

distinguishing features - dark stripe through eye, white stripe above eye, downcurved bill, short rounded wings

Range:

- statewide resident

Habitat:

- almost any habitat that has brush piles, dense understory vegetation,

hollow logs, bird houses, buildings

Diet:

- ants, flies, millipedes, and other insects

- only 10% of diet is plant food such as poison ivy, bayberry, pine,

oak, and sweetgum

Aeproduction: - 2-3 clutches per year from March to August

- 3-6 eggs per clutch

Behavior:

- very active

- switches tail back and forth - often sings year around

- songs are variable

Problems:

- may nest just about anywhere that can support a nest of twigs such as interiors of sheds, eaves, shelves, tin cans, hanging plants. . .

Solutions:

- keep shed doors closed

- prevent access to eaves or other areas that can support a nest

- provide suitable nest box or gord.

Legal Aspects: - permits from the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission

and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are required to destroy or move

nests
